On April 6, 1988, Dr. Gary Cook was called to be the president of Dallas Baptist University. Dr. Cook, his wife, Sheila, and their two sons, David and Mark, moved to Dallas to begin serving at the University. The first three individuals to join the staff were Mitch Bennett, Edith Bond, and Dennis Linam. While the school had a long history of faithful commitment to Christ-centered education, its perpetual debt and financial problems led many to predict that the institution's days were numbered. Dr. Cook refused to believe in these predictions and instead sought guidance from the Lord for the future of the school as he established an Intercessory Prayer Ministry. He called upon the University family as well as a thousand senior adult prayer partners to help him commit the University to the Lord in prayer. Over the next 25 years, through the blessing of the Lord and the leadership of Dr. Cook, the trustees, administration, faculty, and staff, DBU transformed from being financially troubled into a thriving institution. Fall enrollment tripled, the debt was retired, assets grew, over two thousand trees were planted, a colonial-style architecture was established, new buildings were added, and DBU became known as one of the most beautiful campuses in the Southwest. Dr. Cook, along with Harold Norris and Rebecca Brown, established a student ministry to internationals, and the international student population increased from 12 in 1989 to over 500 international students from 53 countries in 2013. In 1993, Dr. Cook led in the development of a new mission statement for DBU, codifying the school's commitment to the integration of faith and learning and an emphasis on the principles of servant leadership. DBU has grown from three master's degree programs in 1988 to twenty-three master's degree programs and two doctoral degree programs in 2013. Today, DBU students can be found throughout the world, striving to serve the world through a variety of vocations, all for the glory of God.
